Things are a lot different for us this year but I suppose in a way the arrival of Spring is giving us some hope. The days will get longer, we will be able to get out into the fresh air a little bit more and hopefully before too long schools will be able to reopen.

In the spirit of Spring bringing with it hope and renewal, I am asking that all boys put an extra effort into their school work across the next two weeks in the run-up to mid-term break (15th-19th February).

The teachers are keeping daily engagement logs for their class and I am monitoring these regularly. I want to encourage all boys to step up the engagement levels on Seesaw across the next two weeks, I really hope to see all boys logging in, engaging with the tasks set and submitting work as often as they can.

Some families have received a phone-call from a staff member with regard to engagement levels and special arrangements have been put in place. <u>Staff will continue to link in with the parents of pupils who are not engaging or submitting work.</u> As I said in my previous letter, this is the only means we have of tracking learning and unfortunately referrals will have to be made to Educational Welfare Officers if we have no contact with a pupil/family.

A link to a **Remote Teaching & Learning Pupil Survey** will be sent today via text. I ask that parents help their son/s to complete this before 8pm tonight as feedback will be taken into account at a remote staff meeting tomorrow morning.

As an extra incentive, at the end of every week a boy from each class will receive a Home Learning Certificate and Prize. This will replace our usual monthly awards for the duration of the closure. The awards will be announced on Thursdays and items will be sent out with the food packs or by post. Good luck to all the boys, I have faith in each and every one of them!
